The Swiss ehpic™ 2017 course will be interactive and engaging with a mix of lectures, small and large group discussions and activities and use of DVD scenarios.

By participating in this course, you have a deep interest in collaborating with the mfe-ehpic™ Swiss team to become early leaders in promoting and developing the Swiss IP-Education and Practice concept. As a teacher and healthcare provider, you will work with the mfe-ehpic™ Swiss team to support, evaluate and promote the implementation of Interprofessional Education and Practice in our country's ambulatory care system.

Implementing successful interprofessional collaboration requires coordination, efficient communication, respect and constant sharing of experiences. The **Swiss ehpic™ 2017** course is designed to give participants basic knowledge on what it takes to become a good collaborator to enhance patient care. Objectives and contents

By the end of the Swiss ehpic™ 2017 course we expect that you will:

- Identify and share with learners the importance of professional role understanding as an essential component for collaborative practice;
- Experience and learn ways to teach effective team communication and the role of reflection in health care teams;
- Acknowledge professional attitudes and cultural values (including patient/client-centred care) and be familiar with their impact in the health system and educational context;
- Recognize the value of simulation for teaching interprofessional education and collaborative practice by engaging in simulation experiences;
- Reflect on, understand and learn ways to teach how collaborative practice is used to enhance patient-centred care;
- Leave the program with concrete ideas to personally promote ways to advance interprofessional education and practice in our care system.

Conditions for participation

Who can participate?

Any health care professional, teacher in health studies, nurses, executives and collaborators of home care, pharmacists, physicians and specialists, physiotherapists, nutritionists, midwives...

Conditions

Participation in this pilot course implies that individuals will be fluent in English. Participants can apply as individuals or in teams with 2-3 different health care professionals who are willing to advance IPE and IPC forward in their contexts.

Individuals and teams interested in participating must submit an application sharing a proposal for a project they intend to work on during the course and over a long term in their practices to advance IPE or IPC.

Participants will be expected to participate in-person for the 3 day course in Solothurn March 22–24, 2017; a 1h30 videoconference 3 months after the course to debrief experiences; and an obligatory one-day meeting sharing project outcomes during the SGAIM congress on September 14–15, 2017.

Participants who complete the pilot course will be considered leaders working with mfe to enhance, promote and develop IPC and IPE in Switzerland in the upcoming years.

Application

Your application must be in English and should enclose a short letter highlighting your individual or team's interest in participating in the course, a description of themselves and members of the team specifically related to IPE and IPC; and provide details of a brief proposal describing an approach to advance IPE and IPC during the course.

Applications will be accepted up until January 31, 2017.
